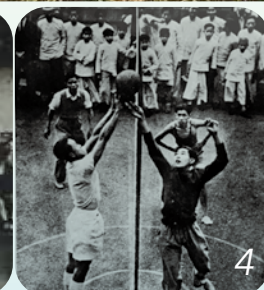


# School History

Queen's College, originally named the Central School, is the first government school set up in Hong Kong in 1862. First located in Gough Street, Central, it provided western education to both Chinese and foreign students. In 1889, the new school building, at the junction of Aberdeen Street and Hollywood Road opened and the school was known as Victoria College. It was renamed Queen's College in 1894 and moved to the present site in Causeway Bay in 1950.

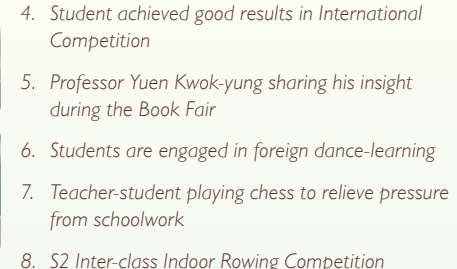

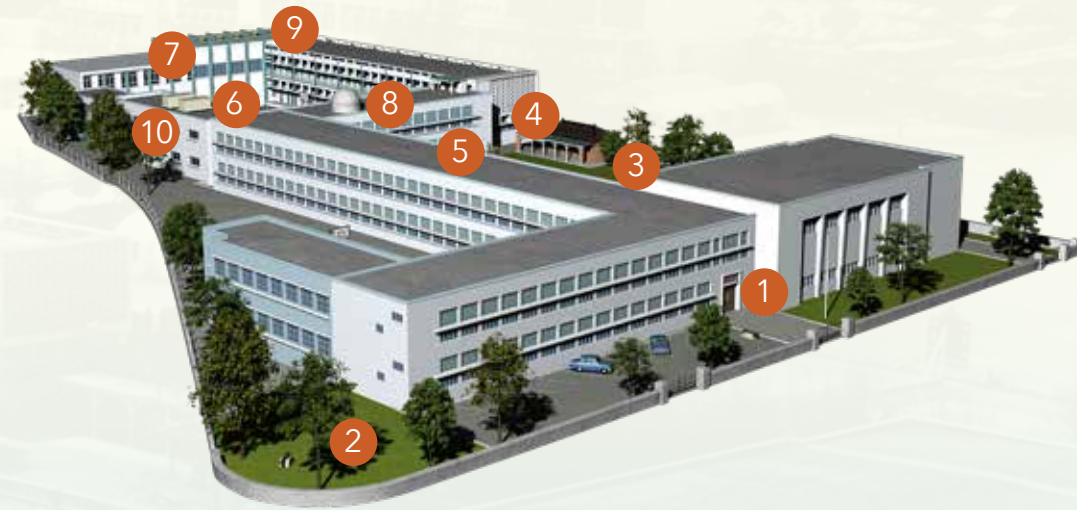

For Tier 1, school-based curricula in Creative Science, Coding, and Mathematics have been developed for fostering creativity, problem solving and collaboration of students. In Tiers 2 and 3, students take part in local and international competitions and various programs offered by local universities every year, including the University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Thanks to the keen and enthusiastic support from our Old Boys, our school's development in STEAM Education has received positive responses and unleashed a lot of potential within our students.

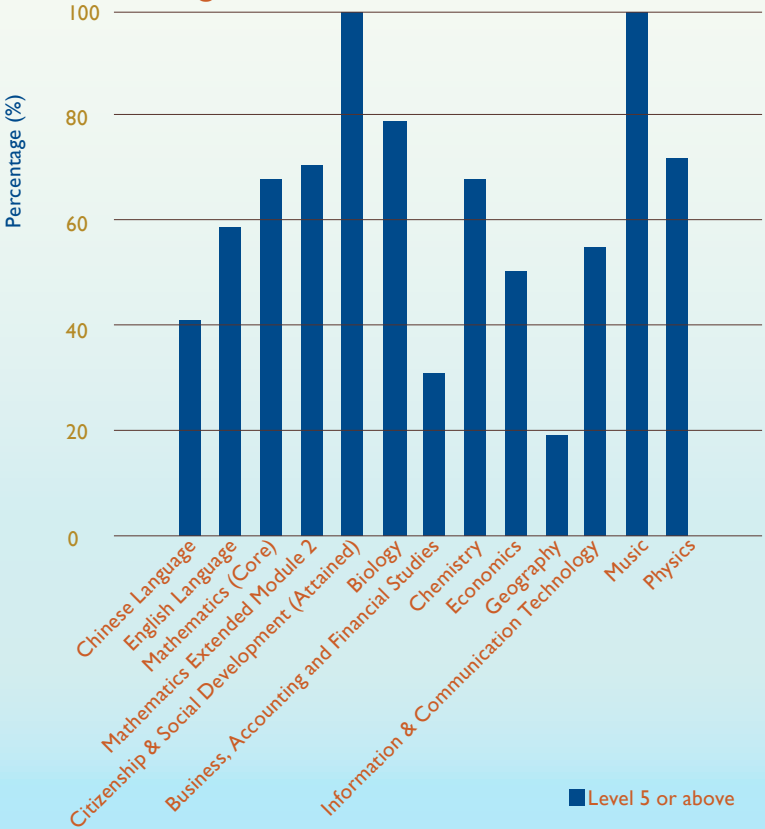

Percentage of students attained Level 5 or above



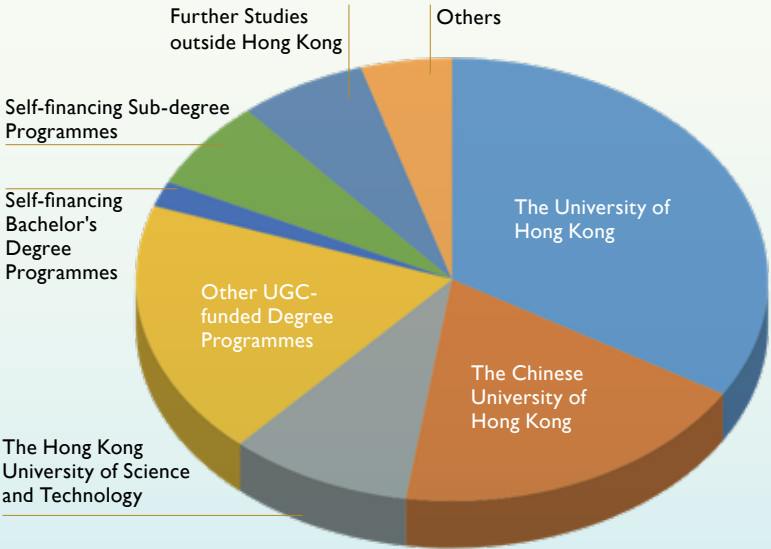
