School History

Queen's College, originally named the Central School, is the first government school set up in Hong Kong in 1862. First located in Gough Street, Central, it provided western education to both Chinese and foreign students. In 1889, the new school building, at the junction of Aberdeen Street and Hollywood Road opened and the school was known as Victoria College. It was renamed Queen's College in 1894 and moved to the present site in Causeway Bay in 1950.


Besides, Queen's College History Museum was opened in March 2017 to celebrate the 155th anniversary of our school.







e-Learning

e-Learning is one of our school's Major Concerns. The school has received full support from the EDB and Old Boys to implement e-Learning, which makes learning and teaching more effective. With the help of various e-Learning tools such as iPads and e-Platforms, students' learning interest is aroused and the learning process can be extended outside the traditional classrooms. Students can learn at their own pace and according to their own interests.



STEM Education and Gifted Education

Following the current trend of STEM Education, our school actively explores opportunities for students by conducting STEM Education according to the 3-tiered model of gifted education. For Tier I, school-based curricula in Creative Science, Coding, and Mathematics have been developed for fostering creativity, problem solving and collaboration of students. In Tiers 2 and 3, students take part in local and international competitions and various programs offered by local universities every year, including the University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Thanks to the keen and enthusiastic support from our Old Boys, our school's development in STEM Education has received positive responses and unleashed a lot of potential within our students.

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Exchange Program 2019

Reflection by Students
Exchange Program with Ulsan Meister High School
(QC to UMHS : 5th September to 9th September, 2019)

Queen's College established a brother-school relationship with Ulsan Meister High School (UMHS) in 2015. Our school has treasured this valuable opportunity for our students and teachers to explore the culture and customs of a different nation and to maintain a long-term friendship. The Korean Ulsan Meister High School Exchange Program 2019 was held from 5th September to 9th September, 2019 for two S5 and six S4 students who were escorted by our assistant principal, Mr. WONG Kwok-keung, and Mr. LEUNG Kin-ching.

Each participant had an unforgettable and amazing trip and broadened their understanding of Korea through various activities and interactions with host families and teachers. In Ulsan, people are very enthusiastic. Wherever we went, friendly greetings such as Ann-yeongha-se-yo (Hello) and Kam-sa Ha-mni-da (Thank you) could be heard. During the five-day accommodation in our Ulsan buddies' homes, our students could feel their hospitality and politeness. We all were treated in a nice manner. The Korean Mums and Dads were extremely caring and attentive. Our students had a brilliant experience with them, and the Korean families made them feel at home. Undoubtedly, this provided QC boys with a chance to really see what daily life in Korea is like. Students might gain far more insights than tourists who never venture into the real Korea. Immersion in a country may also help them learn the language more efficiently, since they could have opportunities to use it every day.

During the exchange program, we savored various kinds of Korean food such as "spicy kim chi", which was delicious. For the Korean dining culture, we had to sit on the floor to enjoy our meals. Our students visited the Hyundai Heavy Industries. They could witness the scale and complexity of the operations of a shipbuilding corporation. Besides, students attended formal classes to learn Confucian culture in Ulsan. We then visited our brother school, Ulsan

Meister High School which is located in the heavy industrial manufacturing city, Ulsan. UMHS is a high school (senior form) in which most of the graduates will work in large national industrial enterprises such as Samsung Corporation and Hyundai Motor Group. The school has developed specific courses to train the youths to be skillful masters and technicians in manufacturing industries.

During the five-day visit, students and teachers travelled to various places. We went to the Ulsan Museum, the Ulsan Grand Park and Haeundae Haesuyokjang, a popular beach in Busan. We also visited the traditional market, modern shopping malls, ancient sites and historical buildings in Busan. Our students and teachers tasted a lot of Korean traditional food and bought different kinds of souvenirs.

Through this exchange program, students immersed themselves in a completely different culture and lifestyle than what they are accustomed to. QC boys were able to fully immerse into the world around them, enabling them to gain a better understanding of Korean culture and lifestyle, rather than viewing it as a tourist. The home-stay experience in Korea let our students gain independence and acceptance towards people of other cultures. This may help them in their future, both at school and beyond. In a multi-cultural world, it may be important to know how to interact with other cultures, especially if students plan to pursue a career in an international company or organization. This tour was definitely an invaluable experience to our students.








